

Bishop Paiute's WQ program staff connected with <u>The Carpentries</u> trainers and TXG Members through TXG's Data Carpentry Ecology workshop, where BPT staff learned the basics of R program language.

The relationships borne out of this workshop created the groundwork for BPT WQ staff to pursue small-group and one-on-one tribal assistance from Angie Reed (Penobscot Nation), as offered through TXG.

TXG-hosted Bi-weekly R Chats January 2020 - June 2020


Facilitated by Angie Reed (TXG), Melinda Ronca-Battista (ITEP), Kunal Marwaha (Carpentries), and others, this webinar-style series offered demonstrations of various R features and uses to BPT WQ staff and others, and provided a continuation of learning from the November 2019 R Workshop.

Weekly TXG Tribal Assistance Calls June 2020 - December 2022

Bishop WQ staff requested one-one-one tribal assistance from Angie Reed through TXG's Tribal Assistance program for more specific training In R. Through virtual calls with Angie, BPT staff learned coding, graphing, and data cleaning in R and R Studio, and remotely outlined the format, content, and calculations needed for their annual <u>BPT Water Quality report</u>.

In 2023, BPT's newest Water Quality professional, Brianda Hernandez, became a TXG member after working with Angie through TXG's Tribal Assistance Program.
