Once again, tribes, EPA, and other environmental protection professionals gathered for the annual Tribal Exchange Network Conference, held February 28-March 2, 2017 in Alpine, California. Attended by 80 individuals, including representatives from more than 30 different tribes and tribal organizations, the conference boasted 25 different presentations and interactive sessions, and five optional post-conference workshops.

Highlights of this year's event, as identified by conference attendees included: Increased involvement and participation by EPA representatives, the interactive sessions and networking opportunities, and the fun and informative poster session & contest. # E-Enterprise Leadership Council Welcomes New Tribal Representatives

The E-Enterprise Leadership Council (EELC) oversees the management and implementation of the E-Enterprise for the Environment initiative, and provides strategic direction for the E-Enterprise and Exchange Network governance activities. The EELC began the process of officially incorporating tribal representatives to its ranks in 2015, but in late 2016, formalized the process of nominating and selecting tribal representatives through the Regional Tribal Operations Committees. As of March 2017, 9 of 10 tribal seats have been filled, making the number of tribal representatives on the EELC nearly on par with state and federal numbers. ## Tribal Governance Group Members Recognized for Outstanding Contributions

At the EELC Fall Meeting, Frank Harjo (Muscogee (Creek) Nation) and Bruce Jones (Northwest Indian Fisheries Commission) were selected to receive awards recognizing them for their outstanding contributions to E-Enterprise and Exchange Network. Tom Burack, State of New Hampshire and Stan Meiburg, US EPA, bestowed the awards to Frank and Bruce with the following commentary:

"Bruce Jones has long been looked to as a leader for tribes in the Exchange Network arena. He regularly serves as a mentor to other tribes, guiding and teaching them principles of data management and exchange. Despite a brief hiatus in early 2016, Bruce has remained involved in both the TGG and the EE Tribal Roadmap project, and has taken on a new role as a tribal representative to the Management Board.

Frank Harjo has demonstrated an enormous level of commitment to the EN/EE initiatives over the past year, stepping up to serve as a tribal representative on various teams, committees, and workgroups, above and beyond his role on the Management Board and as chair of the TGG. Frank helped serve on the hiring committee for the EN Coordinator hired in 2015; he served on the Shared Services IPT; and has participated in the EELC as an interim representative to the group. He has also volunteered to serve as the tribal co-chair for the EN2017 meeting, and has made multiple presentations to tribal and general audiences on Exchange Network and E-Enterprise."



In addition to the recognition by the EELC, the Tribal Governance Group members recognized the dedication of Mr. Robert Holden, National Congress of American Indians, for his long-standing support and advocacy of tribal interests in the Exchange Network.
