Information abounds at the 2016 Tribal EN Conference

The 2016 Tribal Exchange Network Conference (Tribal-EN) was held in Albuquerque, New Mexico, February 9-10. This year's Conference attracted 75 attendees from over 40 tribal organizations, as well as representatives from EPA, state and other

organizations. Several pre-conference training sessions were offered, and staff from the Pueblo of Sandia offered an informative and educational tour of their wetland restoration efforts along the Rio Grande. The agenda was kicked off by a Keynote Address given by Ann Dunkin, Chief Information Officer for the EPA's Office of Environmental Information. The Tribal-EN Poster Session offered a unique opportunity for attendees to interact and learn more about tribal projects in an informal atmosphere.

Tribal Mentorship Workshop for TrEX a Success

In March, ITEP held a mentoring workshop for tribal users involved in the TrEX (Tribal Exchange Network), a collaborative effort led by the Walker River Paiute Tribe to aid tribes in exchanging continuous air and water quality data. Since its inception in the early 2000s, the TrEX project has attracted dozens of tribes, yet staff turnover and other issues present continual challenges. This workshop provided a forum for tribal users to identify persistent problems and discuss potential solutions, as well as to share insights, tips and other helpful information with each other. ITEP is currently seeking

Tribal Consultation on E-Enterprise Leadership Council Draft Charter

The E-Enterprise for the Environment governance draft charter establishes the E-Enterprise Leadership Council and other governance bodies. EPA is seeking increased tribal participation throughout E-Enterprise governance, in particular on the Leadership Council, and is seeking comments on the draft charter language as it pertains to tribes.
